Dear Liz.

1. Further to our meetings on 31st May 2022 and yesterday 7th June 2022 in relation to the Anne Street Investigation and subsequent report issued by Wexford Co Council on 10th Oct 2016.
2. Arising from the meeting yesterday with yourself and Anita McLoughlin and Seamus Power and myself, I am concerned that you misunderstand my core issue in relation to the Anne Street Investigation.
3. For the avoidance of doubt my complaint is twofold, firstly, the agreed format for conducting the Anne Street Investigation was subsequently altered by the [REDACTED] and as a result the investigation was not properly conducted or concluded.
4. As a result of the flawed investigation process the report issued by Wexford Co Council on 10th October 2016 was incomplete and misleading.
5. As a result of the flawed investigation and inaccurate report, I was deprived of facts and information that should have been openly available to me in September October 2016 to assist me with my business and legal affairs.
6. Instead, it took me many years to establish facts and information that should have been openly available to me In September October 2016 had the investigation and Wexford Co Council Report been done properly.
7. The report and exhibits I submitted to your predecessor David Minogue on 2nd February 2022 clearly show how the agreed investigation process was undermined by [REDACTED] and further shows how important FOI documents were excluded from the October 2016

report, which will become clear to you when you complete your own review of that report which I submitted to David Minogue.

8. The flawed investigation and inaccurate Report are not a matter for debate but is clearly a matter of fact and other issues should not be introduced by you now, which distract from the flawed/ improper investigation and misleading report.
9. I explained all the above to Tom Enright and David Minogue when I met them in the Council Offices on 20th January last and I understood then that Tom Enright accepted my position when he asked on several occasions what I wanted the Council to do to rectify matters (see notes of that meeting)
10. As I understand the purpose of our two recent meetings is to agree how the council can resolve the damage that was caused to me as a result of the flawed investigation and inaccurate and misleading report of October 2016, and I look forward to meeting with you before the weekend to resolve this matter once and for all.
